



## **LYNDHURST COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL PE PREMIUM STATEMENT 2015/2016**

During the school year of 2015-2016, the school has received **£8960** to improve the quality of sport and PE provision at Lyndhurst Community Primary School. Our vision is to create a culture that encourages all children to be active and have positive attitudes towards physical activity and healthy lifestyles. The impact of this funding will be measured by school and progress of pupils will be highlighted.

### **The funding will develop a programme which includes:**

- High quality physical education as part of the curriculum
- Extracurricular clubs for those wanting to progress skills
- Enough competitive school sport opportunities for those children who want to take part
- Leadership opportunities
- Activities designed to meet the needs of our least active young children through schemes such as Change4Life clubs.
- A full and varied PE CPD offer to staff and parents
- A comprehensive action plan for all areas of PE & school sport

We believe high quality physical education and school sport will contribute to a range of outcomes for our children. Not only does it equip young people with physical literacy while supporting their physical development, movement skills and body confidence, but it also contributes to their physical, mental and social well-being.

More specifically the funding has been predominantly targeted in the following ways:

#### **- Development of competition (school games).**

All children enjoy being appropriately challenged and at a young age most are keen to explore their capabilities. At our school, competitive sport will be focussed on achieving one's 'personal best' rather than being the 'best.' All children will be given the opportunity to demonstrate their personal best in competitive sports competitions.

Children currently experience the following competitive sports: basketball, football, gymnastics, hockey, dodgeball, tag rugby, tennis, dance and netball.

Approximately **£ 2750** will be targeted towards lunch time/after school clubs in some of these competitive sports. Experienced and suitably qualified coaches or existing school staff will enable children to be able to learn more about specific sports, receive age-appropriate coaching and practise their skills.

As part of the 'Sainsbury's School Games' we will be developing our intra-school sports competitions (Level 1) and will target approximately **£1000** towards this. Pupils will be also be encouraged to develop their skills in Inter School competition (Level 2) also.



- **Development of Curriculum PE**

There will be an investment of **£5000\*** spent on developing curriculum PE lessons. This will be delivered by Ms Angela Oatley (part of the PLT) and schemes of work will be produced and developed with the assistance of school staff. Where possible, staff will be encouraged to be involved in the lessons and also use assessment to show pupil progress. The recommendations of the new National Curriculum guidelines will be adhered to where possible.

- **Development of 'Change4Life clubs' and other Health related activity.**

To engage our children in physical activity and exercise, particularly our least active children, the focus needs to be on enjoyment and the opportunity to try something new and different. Approximately **£1800\*\*** will be used in developing Health related activity for example Change4Life Clubs & Lunchtime clubs i.e. Yoga, Fitness sessions, daily jobs. It will provide all year groups the opportunity to try appealing activities that include plenty of exercise and promote wider health and well-being messages.

- **Continual Professional Development of teaching staff.**

Approximately **£1000** will be spent on professional development opportunities for teachers. These opportunities will predominantly be provided through the 'Tameside School Sport Partnership'; the PE subject leader at Lyndhurst Community Primary school and teachers working alongside qualified sports coaches.

- **Partnership Working**

**£6500\*\*\*** will be spent on membership of a local schools working group led by Tameside School Sports Partnership. This group will bulk buy resource on behalf of the collective of schools (ensuring value for money) and share good practice, support action planning and ensure monitoring & evaluation of premium funding.

- **PE resources / equipment.**

Approximately **£696** has been spent on ensuring we are now fully resourced in terms of resources/equipment to deliver high quality PE.

- **Transport**

Approximately **£250** will be spent on transport for school sport fixtures/trips. We will not ask parents for a contribution towards transport costs.



## **Sustainability & Monitoring**

We will endeavour to use the funding to make high quality PE and sport sustainable and effective. Our on-going CPD programme for staff, links with Tameside School Sports Partnership and the use of coaches, volunteers and parents who have links to local clubs to provide further participation opportunities beyond the school day, will help achieve this.

We will also be monitoring all activity to ensure that we can evaluate the effectiveness of the funding and the value for money it brings.

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\*£5000 covers the cost of Ms Angela Oatley.

\*\*£1800 is included in the money spent on Lunch time and after school clubs.

\*\*\*£6500 includes the cost of Ms Angela Oatley, Tameside CPD partnership and competition entry.
